We will gather at RCCPC at 5:30 on Friday May 17, 2013. The drive time is about two hours.

We will advise no later than the gathering time on May 17, 2013 the parent Sunday return for pick up time. Pick up will be in the RCCPC upper parking lot.

### **Program and Activity Information**

We will be camping in the Ockanickon Scout Reservation. On Saturday morning all scouts will be doing Low COPE and team building activities. On Saturday afternoon, part of the troop will do High COPE and the other part will go rock climbing at a nearby wall in Ralph Stover State Park. On Sunday morning a second group of scouts will go rock climbing, the scouts who went rock climbing on Saturday will do High COPE, and the remainder of the group will participate in a service project at Camp Ockanickon. There will be campfire entertainment on Saturday night. We will NOT be doing night COPE; we will NOT be doing water COPE.

Camping will be in tents.

Each scout will be expected to pack for changeable May weather, which can be relatively warm to hot during the day and cool at night.

Cooking for the weekend will be by patrol using open fires/ camp stoves.
